This week the results of a pre-election opinion poll were announced. The poll was conducted by the Center of Information and Analysis under the Presidential Administration



Potential activity of respondents has risen. 92% of the respondents intend to come to the polling place. The vast majority of poll respondents (76.5%) assume that the political situation in the Republic of Belarus is calm.

Early voting has started at 10 am all over the country

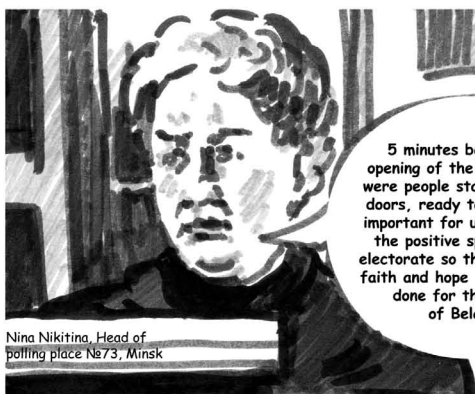
Around the country, more than 6.000 polling places have opened up. Many foreign observers are monitoring the vote. Statements attest the good level of preparation for the elections.

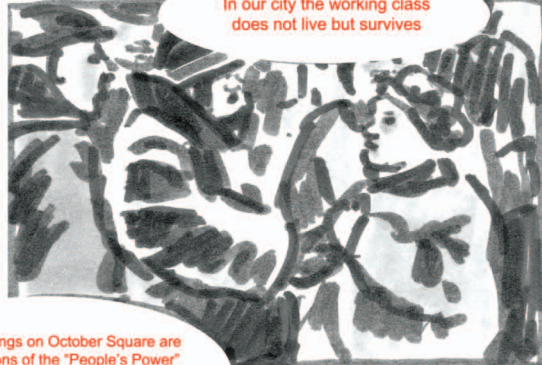

Ales was arrested for the second time, so that Krupsk region won't rebel against the regime. We need to support Pushkin who is not with us now



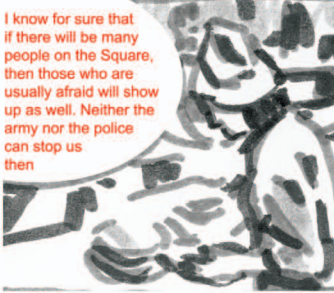
It is hard to hunger strike. There are approximately 6-9 degrees plus, I was laying down with the jacket on me, I was saving the power and the energy

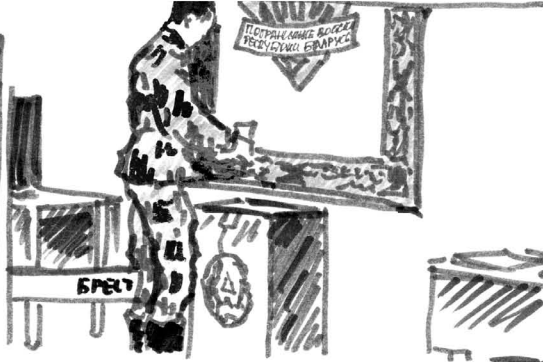

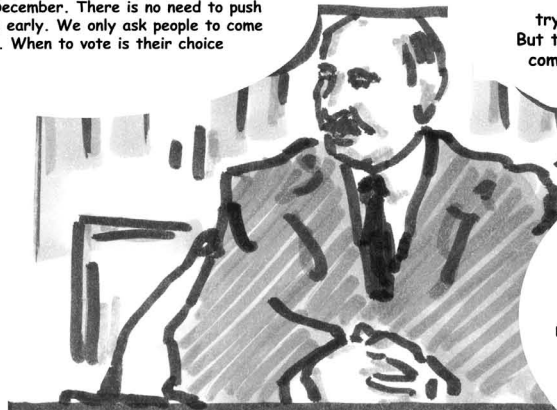

The power of the government is so strong nowadays that we don't need to undertake any special measures. Though we have to be ready for everything

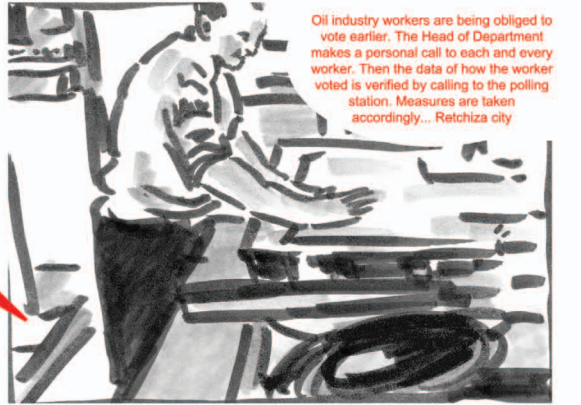
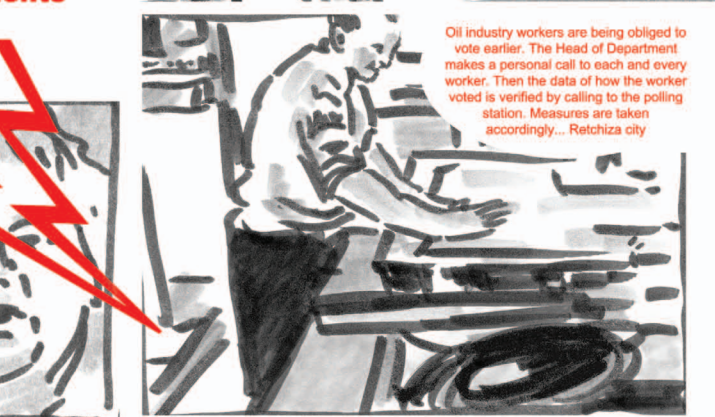
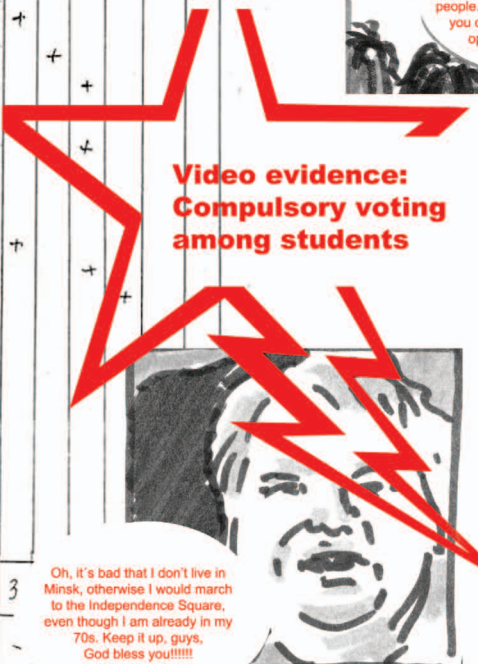

Citizens of Belarus can vote in one of 6390 polling places



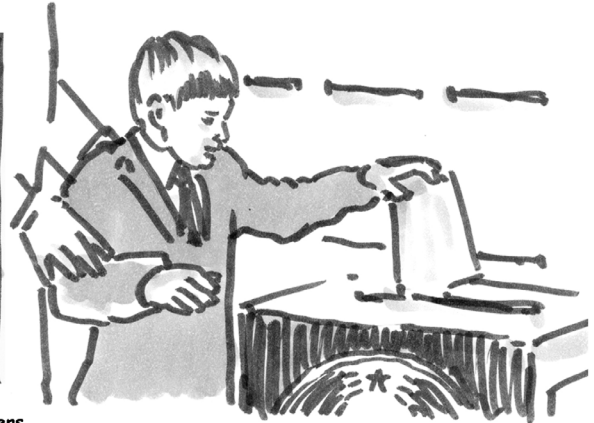

A car with people in black uniform was waiting on the Collectorny street until the group of demonstrators came closer. Sound equipment for the demonstration on Independence Square was confiscated by police.

We were marching along Independence Square and shouting: "Long live Belarus! Motherland! Freedom! Luka, the jerk, get off!". Every minute more and more people were coming. We were happy and what is most important— we were FREE! Together we were strong! The Young and the Old, the disabled and the healthy... we were one

21.40 Independence square is crowded with people. There are approximately 30 to 40 thousands of people



Roads to Minsk are blocked. People from the regions who are heading to the demonstration to Minsk are being detained

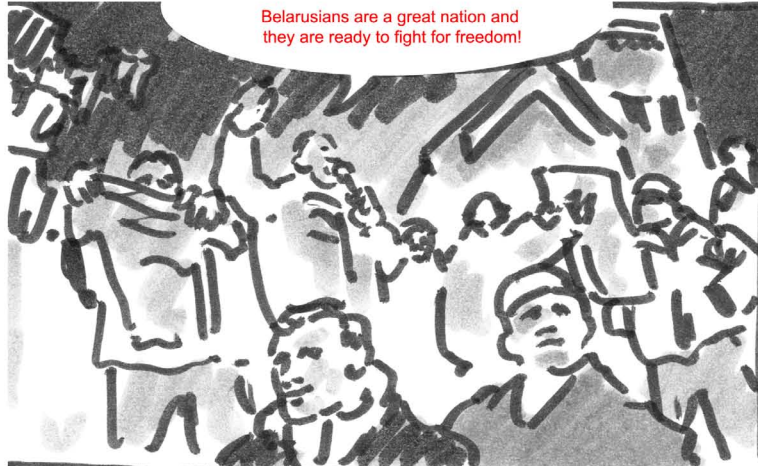

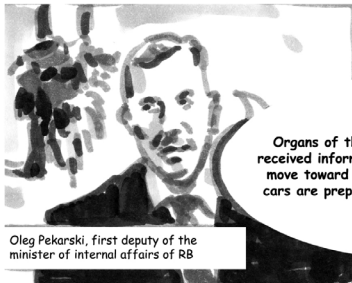

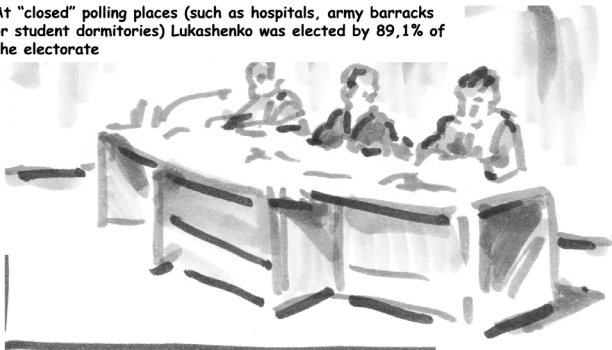
Organs of the Ministry for Internal Affairs received information that two buses are going to move toward the Square at around 7 pm. Two cars are prepared with instruments for causing explosions



Information about these tools was confirmed as they were found in the buses and are now being inspected



At "closed" polling places (such as hospitals, army barracks or student dormitories) Lukashenko was elected by 89,1% of the electorate

At the closed polling places for Alexander Lukashenko voted 89,1% of the electorate. 89,87% in Brest region, 91,47% in Vitebsk, 88,59% in Gomel region, 92,29% in Grodno region, 90,2% in Minsk region, 86,2% in Mogilev, 85,4% in Minsk.

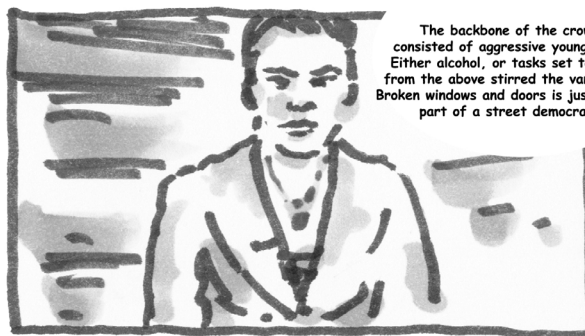

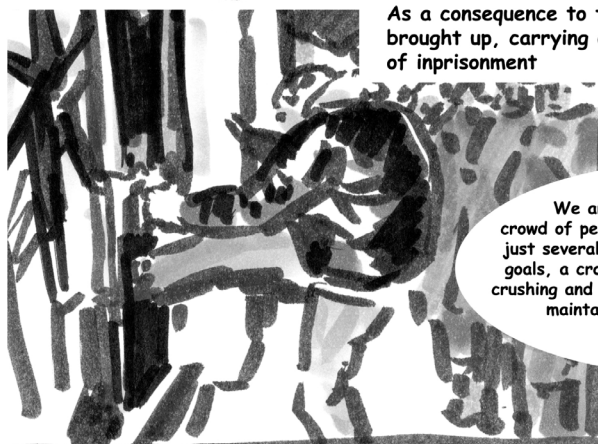
Patient Neklyayev was brought to the hospital and diagnosed with facial as well as occipital traumas. Fortunately, computer tomography showed no signs of pathology. After the patient was examined, we recommended that he should undergo outpatient treatment, but Neklyayev refused

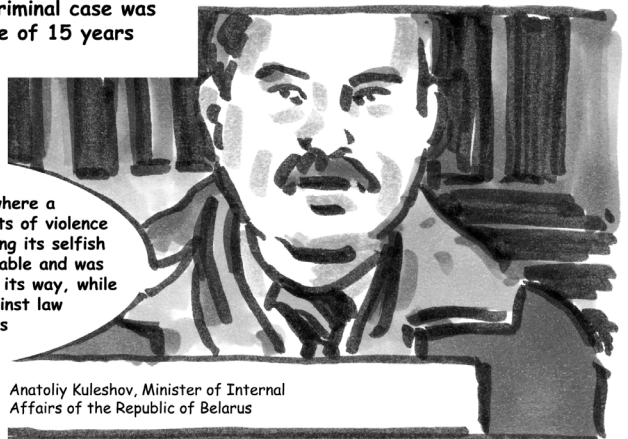

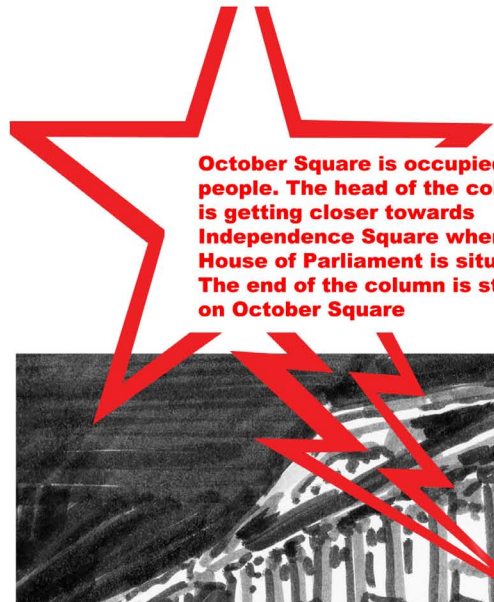


As a consequence to the mass riots, a criminal case was brought up, carrying a maximum sentence of 15 years of imprisonment

I talked to one person who was on duty in the House of Parliament on the second floor that day. He said he was already informed 5 days before the events that demonstrators would come to the House. So either conversations were wiretapped, or the was was an informer

I don't know why he beat us, we didn't resist at all. He hit me in my legs by the stick and said that I should stand up and go. But I couldn't get up

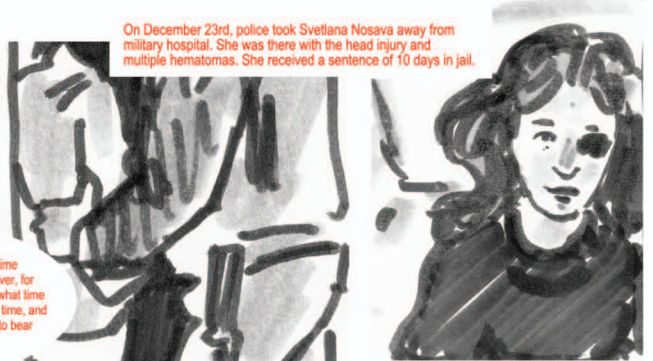


The cell was designed to accommodate 6 people, but it had twice more people. We «came» a little earlier, therefore there was not enough blankets and pillows, but they didn't help – the cell was too cold. Those who didn't get space, slept on the floor, squeezing one another. In the same cell there was a toilet: behind the low wall there was a toilet seat with the water tap hanging over it. There was no a sink

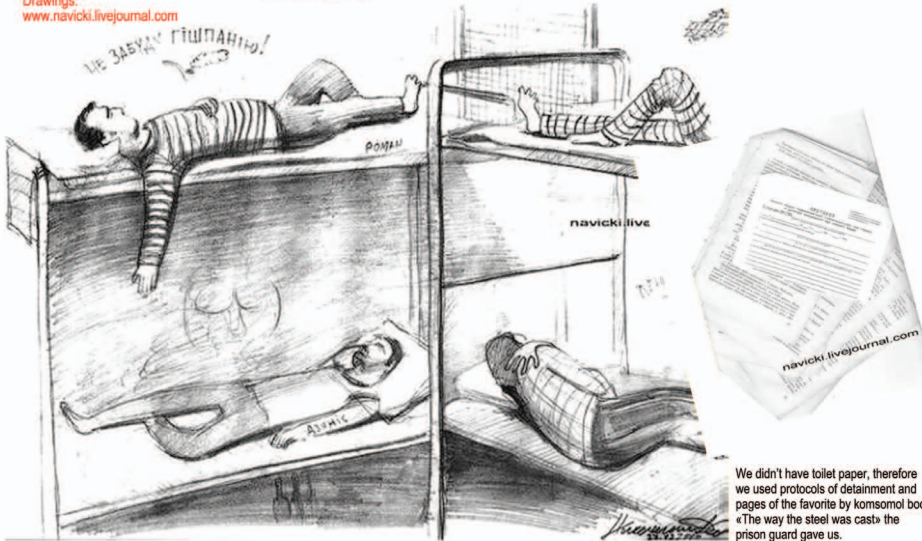
They drove us around for a long time, I cannot tell now how long. I only know that we were frozen and totally exhausted. Our feet were wet, and it was so cold in the car that we were not even shivering since we no longer felt our body. Our feet were numb

The light in cell was on all the time and it was difficult to sleep. Moreover, for some reason they refused to tell us what time it was. We were totally disoriented in time, and certainly, it was the hardest thing to bear

On December 23rd, police took Svetlana Nosava away from military hospital. She was there with the head injury and multiple hematomas. She received a sentence of 10 days in jail.

I didn't see other presidential candidates. The conditions were inhuman. Cells are size 3x4 meters. There are 5 people in there. I slept on the floor. There was no toilet. We were allowed to go to the bathroom twice a day. In the morning and at night. I am concerned with Neklyayev's health, he may not last too long there

There were a lot of guys with head injuries, people were in blood all over. There was a man who asked for urgent help but police refused. The man had a broken arm and broken teeth. I saw another man with broken arms, but he was pretending nothing had happened to him

If you want problems with the investigator, try to exercise speeches with him. Head injuries, broken limbs and face in tears would be guaranteed. They don't like those who are too smart. We are not in EU or USA, we don't have democratic government institutes, nor have we independent prosecution and attorneys. Those who experienced Belarusian courts know that it is all formality

That's it Sergey, you are in trouble. Do you know that the case on the attempt to overthrow the government has been opened?

But what do you personally need? Money? How much?

When I smack you in the face, the conversation will change

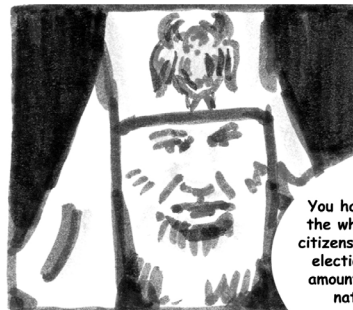
Let's make a deal: we will give you a sentence of about 5 years. You will still have time to do your master's. And should you have a desire and are in good health, you can work for a while in KGB

I think not everyone is able, after going through many-hours of interrogation with no bathroom breaks, to hold on and not to start telling the «right» things. Many witnesses can «turn into» suspects

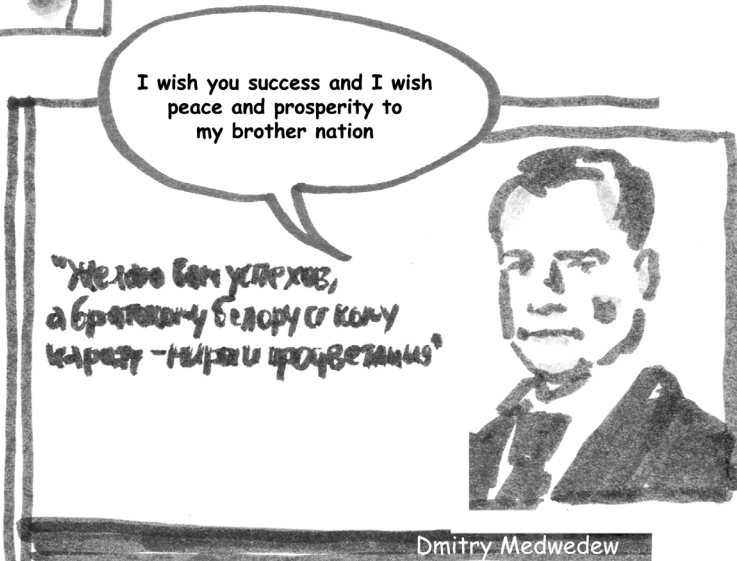

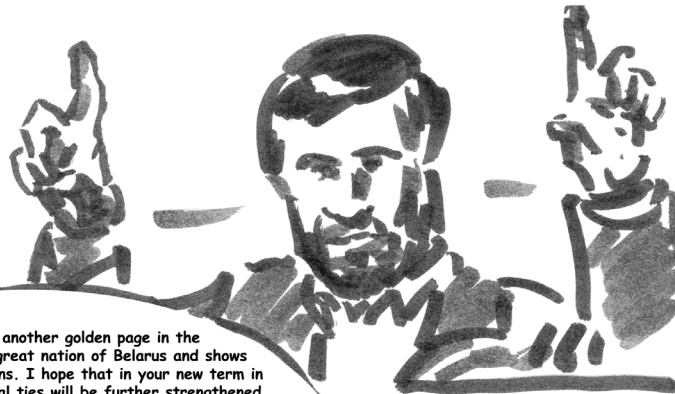

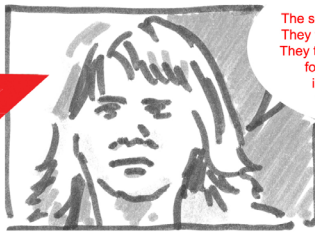

Searches are taking place in suspects' apartments. Editorial offices of the independent media are destroyed and there are long lines in front of KGB offices for interrogations



Another search in journalist's apartment

The search was held at my house. They took my computer and disks. They took me to KGB, interrogated for three hours. They were interested in activities of the Belsat TV channel



I chose to remain silent during the interrogation and received blows in my head, chest and face

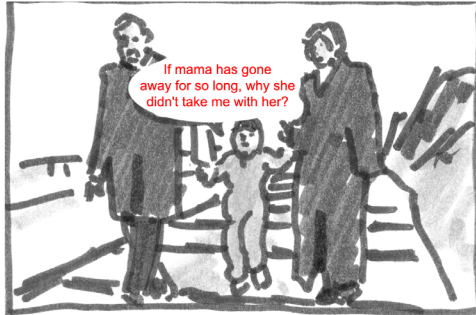


A journalist from Grodno was beaten up during the interrogation in KGB

For the second day they don't let us out of the mobile prisons. The jail on Okrestino St is refusing to take us because it's already full. There are 31 people in the car. They hold us without food and water



Officially, Belarus is happily preparing for New Years celebration. This is that Belarus they show on BT channel. True Belarus spend their days standing by the prison on Okrestino st, bringing the packages of food to their relatives and sometimes to completely unknown people.



If mama has gone away for so long, why she didn't take me with her?

The parents of Danik, Andrei Sannikov, the leading oppositional candidate, and his wife Irina Khalip, a famous journalist, are among those arrested. Along with more than 30 other people, they are threatened with up to 15 years in jail for the organization of mass protests.



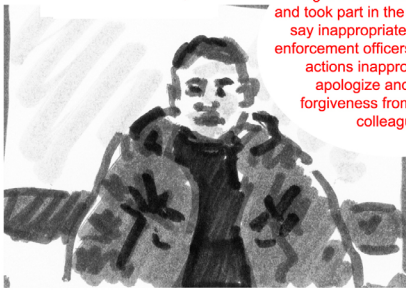

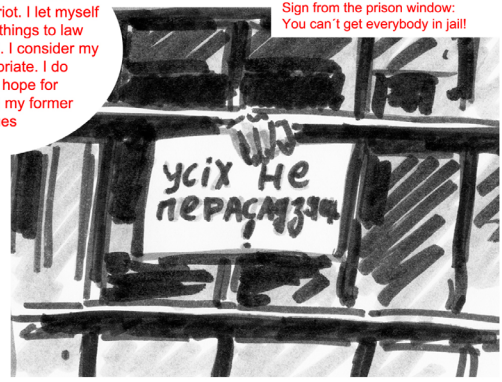
They beat him up during the detention, insulted him, said that they will show him "another life" in "Amerikanka" – a special jail which belongs to the KGB. It's good that his children did not see that

On December 20th, the former police officer Alexander Klaskovsky was arrested at his home in Minsk. The video record, in which he, with blood on his head, is trying to convince special troops not to use force against the demonstrators, became widely known. At the moment Klaskovsky is detained along with other suspects

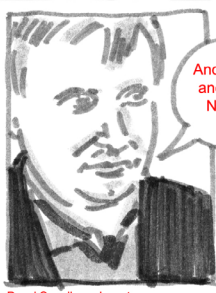

My father and I were at the square. We were ready to go home and went to the subway. They got us there... knocked down to the snow... beat us up... Then was the police car... Detention center... They will definitely kick me out of the institute... But I went to study a discipline important for my father's business. Do you think they will take his business away from him now? They can... But even if they take everything away – I don't regret it! We did the right thing. I'm glad, my father and I were together at the Square.



They began a massive campaign of expelling students, who took part in protest actions against the results of the elections, from schools and universities.



Andrei Sannikov was severely beaten and looks horrible. He cannot move. Neklyuev is not allowed access to his advocate

Pavel Sapelko, advocate of Andrei Sannikov

We are tortured, humiliated and slandered. There is no faith anymore, neither faith in the church after Kril's congratulations, nor faith in God. Nobody wanted revolution, we wanted to have honest elections – but we got terror. And I had thought Stalinism was gone for good. But, God, it's coming back!



Bobruisk police got awarded 4.000.000 for the violent suppression of protests at the Square and the beating of women



Dmitry Anatolyevich, You said that elections are an inner matter of Belarus, and that it is the choice of the Belarusian people. But we, the Belarusian people, did not elect a dictator. He made the decision himself. You cannot beat a cheater
